Audio Visual Equipment Requirements 🔪

- Laptop provide a MacBook Pro OR MacBook Air 2018 model or newer (unless provided by JFI) Note: In most cases, Greg will bring his own laptop to run his presentation.
- LCD projector a projector with a minimum rating of 4500 lumens. Typical Power-Point portable projector is not adequate. Please work with John Foley, Inc. and your AV technician to select a projector with the correct lumens rating for your venue and screen size. The presentation is presented in 16:9 aspect ratio.
- Screen or Multiple Screens as large as possible, to be seen by the entire audience. Preferably two screens where appropriate for the venue.
- Sound system a high-quality sound system is needed to accommodate dramatic music and sound from the video. Free-standing external speakers to augment ceiling speakers are recommended when appropriate for the venue.
- Lavalier wireless microphone for Greg
- Additional microphone for person introducing Greg and Q&A
- HDMI cable to connect projector to computer; audio cable to connect sound system to computer. Greg will
 bring adapters for computer.
- Switcher to transition from other computers to Greg's laptop if there are other computers being used during the meeting.
- Lighting To achieve optimal results during video playback, we recommend dimming the lighting if possible.
- Please provide a cell phone number in case we need to reach AV/Production for any last minute changes.

It's best if the small table is off to the side, or closer to the rear of the stage, as Greg uses the front of the stage throughout his presentation to walk around. When Greg exits the stage, please have someone gather up his helmet and backup laptop with adapter.
